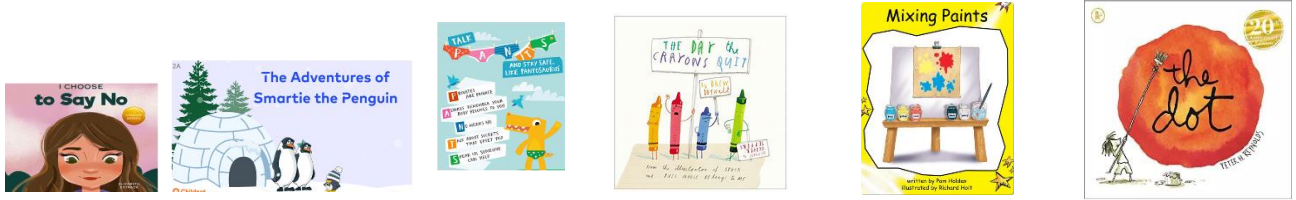


KS1 Autumn 1

What is my child learning this term?

Books that will be shared with the children this term:



Literacy (Reading)	Literacy (Writing)	Mathematics	
<p>Children will continue their daily phonics, learning their set 1, set 2 and 3 sounds and developing reading fluency. As children become fluent readers, they will move onto comprehension reading activities.</p> <p>We encourage children to read at least three times a week at home to support them with their fluency and comprehension.</p> <p>How many Golden books do you think you will be able to read this half term?</p>	<p>This half term, we will be reading the text 'The Day the crayons quit' by Oliver Jeffers. Children will build their own sentences using the text for inspiration. We will also be learning about the history of toys. To support this area of their learning, the children will be looking at a non-fiction text called 'Toys and games' Year one will be focusing on hold a sentence using a capital letter and full stop. Year two will be focusing on using capital letters and full stops correctly, use of conjunctions and developing letter formation and presentation.</p>	<p>This half term the children will be revisiting place value.</p> <p>Year one children will be learning to count, recognise and compare numbers to 10, counting to and from 20 and counting in tens.</p> <p>Year two will be looking at composition of multiples of 10, counting and representing numbers 20 – 99, comparing and ordering 2-digit numbers and securing fluency in addition and subtraction to 20.</p> <p>The children will also be using mastering number 4 times a week to help embed their knowledge and skills.</p>

<p>This unit encourages children to think about online safety and exploring Purple Mash</p>	<p>Children will be learning about safety and he changing body. This includes looking at online safety, road safety, how to keep ourselves safe and safe use of medicines.</p>	<p>Children will be completing a dance unit called toys. They will explore how to use objects and body parts to move to a rhythm.</p>	<p>Children will be developing their throwing and catching skills. They will look at throwing and catching different objects and using different styles of throwing.</p>

They will be looking at how toys have changed over time.</p>	<p>Children will be exploring make your mark and painting. They will be learning about artist Clarice Cliff who is best known for her Art Deco pottery patterns.</p>
